Have your circumstances changed?

In these unprecedented times many of us will encounter difficulties that we never would have foreseen or expected. As a school we want to help you if we can. Please let us know if you need support. We may have ways of helping, or can reach out to other organisations that have the resources to do so. Emotionally or financially, physically or virtually, there are people who care and want to help others.



In addition, if your employment situation has changed, you may be entitled to free school meals (FSM), if so, please go to:

If eligible, as a school, we can provide food vouchers (£15 per week per child) whilst we are closed and free meals, cooked on site, when we reopen.

Sadly, we are not able to provide vouchers for those children that are normally entitled to universal free school meals (5-7 year olds) whilst we are closed, unless their families fall into the categories below:

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:


- o Income Support
- o income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- o income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- o support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- o the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- o Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for
 Working Tax Credit
- O Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Being entitled to FSM, in this way, can also release other future financial benefits to the school and ultimately your child.

Learning activities will be continued to be set, for each year group, for every week during term time – next week will be:


Week Five – Week Beginning Monday 4th May 2020.
