#### NEU Strike Action

In response to our earlier letter regarding the plans for strike action, we regret to inform you that we must restrict attendance to the school on **Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July.** 

In line with government advice, and following consultation with the Local Authority, attendance has been prioritised for the following groups:

- Vulnerable pupils
- Children of critical workers

If your child is within the groups above, they can attend school – please inform the school office if you require your child to attend.

The school will remain <u>open</u> for Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6. If your child is within these groups, please ensure that they attend school as usual. They cannot stay off school if their siblings are at home, due to their class being closed – this would be recorded as unauthorised absence.

Year 6's second transition day to Charters has been cancelled, so Year 6 can attend school on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July

#### The school will <u>close</u> for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and Year 3.

We apologise for the inconvenience and understand any frustration you may feel – the decision has not been taken lightly and is due to fewer teaching staff, which means we can only assure the safety and wellbeing of a reduced number of pupils on this day.

We will keep you up-to-date with any further news in the event that negotiations between the government and the Education Unions progress and see the future strikes are called off or postponed.
